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### Leading Change Institute (formerly Frye)

Supported by CLIR and EDUCAUSE, the Leading Change Institute explores higher education challenges, empowering librarians and information technologists to initiate conversations and take action on issues of importance not just to their individual institutions, but to the entire higher education community. Fellows in the Institute hear from speakers from a wide range of backgrounds who will share real-life problems from across the higher education landscape for which participants will be challenged to devise and propose solutions.

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## **LIBER Leadership Development Programme**

The LIBER leadership programme is aimed at “emerging leaders”, people who are already in senior management positions, but who wish to do more to enhance their leadership qualities in preparation for the step up to the next big challenge – that of taking responsibility for leading an organisation through changing times.

The curriculum will deepen your insights and broaden your repertoire of useful approaches to leadership. The program also provides a valuable opportunity to assess your own leadership strengths and weaknesses in a supportive and engaging learning environment.

The Leadership Institute for Academic Librarians is limited to those with significant leadership and/or administrative responsibility at a college university library, and who show high promise for making a significant contribution in the future. Applications from library directors, university librarians, and their associates and direct reports will be considered on a rolling basis.
